

Growth Group Discussion Guide

Passage: Hebrews 10:32-39

Overview: In this passage, the author encourages his readers to press on by faith, even in the face of suffering. He reminds them of God's work in their past, God's promises for their future, and God's will for their present circumstances. This passage shows us how we can live confidently for Christ in a culture that is increasingly opposed to biblical truth.



Consider verses 32-34. What kind of sufferings had these Christians endured? Why do you think they were tempted to "shrink back" from their biblical beliefs? (v. 39)

In verse 32 the author reminds these Christians of God's work in their lives. **Read Hebrews 6:4-5, Acts 26:18, and Ephesians 1:17-18.** Based on these passages, what does it mean to be enlightened by God? *Resource: Irresistible Grace*

Verse 34 reminds us that our ability to endure hardship comes from our confidence in God's promises. **Consider verse 37.** What has God promised His people? Compare: 1 Peter 1:3-5; 2 Peter 1:3-4



Have you ever shrunk back from being known as a Christian or having biblical beliefs? What fear or desire may have been ruling your heart in that moment? *Resource: The Fear-Driven Life*

How do God's promises for the future address our fears in the present? Consider: Matthew 5:10-12



Our faith is strengthened when we recount God's work in our lives and community. Share about how you came to Christ or how God sustained you through a hard season.

How do we experience opposition for our faith today? **Consider verse 34.** How can we respond to opposition with compassion and joy? Consider: 1 Peter 3:13-17 *Resource: What Only Suffering Can Say*

Lord Jesus Christ, and God our Father, who loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace, comfort our hearts (or the heart of ______) and establish us (him, her) in every good work and word. (Based on 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17)

O Lord, help us (or _____) always to rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, and be constant in prayer. (Based on Romans 12:12)

God our Savior, help us (or ______) to faithfully intercede in prayer with supplication and thanksgiving for all people in positions of power, that we (he, she) may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way, which is pleasing to you. (Based on 1 Timothy 2:1-3)
