

## **Growth Group Discussion Guide**

Passage: Hebrews 3:1-6

**Introduction:** What questions or doubts about Christianity do you hear in our culture?

**Overview:** In this passage the author of Hebrews addresses real doubts of his readers by considering the ministry of Moses. The author compares Moses and Jesus by demonstrating that Moses was always meant to point to Christ. Ultimately, this passage encourages us to see that confidence in our faith flows from addressing our doubts directly and studying the person and the work of Jesus.



The value of Moses' ministry was a crucial question to original audience of Hebrews. How does the author of Hebrews address this question? Does anything surprise you about how this topic is addressed?

Throughout the passage the author of Hebrews compares and contrasts Jesus and Moses. How are Moses and Jesus similar? How are they different?

In verse 5 the author of Hebrews describes Moses as a servant who faithfully pointed to Christ. How do we see Christ anticipated in the Old Testament? Does this change how we read the Old Testament?

**Read John 20:24-29.** How does Jesus respond to those who have questions or doubts? Does Jesus expect blind faith from us?
